
Western Red Cedar

Wild Strawberry

This is a small but flavourful red berry plant.

Size: small

See: 3 leaves, red berries

Salal

Related to the blueberry plant, this native forest shrub has stiff leaves, and blue edible berries.

Size: bush

See: waxy leaves, blue berries.

Use: tasty fruit!





Licorice Fern

This feathery looking plant grows on trees. It gets its name because the roots, when chewed taste like licorice.

Size: small

See: fan-like leaves. Use: tasty roots!





Stinging Nettle


This plant has long, thin, dangling flowers, and its hairs will sting you if you touch it, but if cooked, the pointy leaves are very nutritious.

Size: medium

See: veins on leaves, small spikes.

Use: healthy leaves.





Blackberry


This plant has big juicy berries for everyone to enjoy. Watch out for its thorns!

Size: bush

See: thorns, black berries.

Use: tasty fruit!





Chickweed

This small, skinny plant can be eaten like spinach. It has very small white flowers in spring.

Size: small

See: tiny leaves, and tiny

white flowers.

Use: healthy leaves.





Dandelion


One of the most common weeds, the leaves and yellow flowers of this plant are nutritious and edible.

Size: small

See: yellow flower, bunched

green leaves. Use: healthy leaves.





Yarrow

The feathery leaves of this plant have traditionally been used to stop a cut from bleeding.

Size: medium

See: feathery leaves, white flowers

grouped like umbrella. Use: leaves stop bleeding.
