In addition to the environmental dangers, salmons have a lot of predators. As a baby (fry), your salmon had to worry about other fish, snakes and birds. In the ocean, it had to worry about killer whales, dolphins, seals, sea lions, other fish and humans.

It is your new goal to keep _____safe, during the migration back to a river to spawn.

On your way home, you pass a storm drain on the road. You think that you have seen people pouring chemicals down the drain. What can you do to let people know that these chemicals go into the rivers where salmon live?

Some ways to take care of streams are:

- Plant vegetation on the sides to stabilize banks
- Leave natural plants and debris like stumps and boulders where they are
- · Leave all animal life where it is
- Use garden and lawn chemicals sparingly and with care
- Remove garbage from the stream area
