I am making new buds to grow and they hate the snow and ice. Bald Eagles make nests on me.

I am making flowers and blooming. Red squirrel and Raccoon live near me. My bark is fire-resistant. I need a normal amount of water or I stop growing.

my bark can heal burns.

With lots of sunshine and water, I **make lots of delicious berries** for **Red Squirrel**, **Raccoon** and **Squamish people** to eat. After a fire, I quickly regrow myself. I don't like droughts – I need water.

I live near the river and  
Chinook Salmon. My  
roots like wet soil.  
When it gets cool, my  
leaves turn to yellow or  
red.

# Salmonberry

My branches have lots of prickles. I am dormant, not growing, when it is cold and snowy in winter. I wake up when it gets warmer.
